



AMGC ASSISTANCESHIP FOR AFRICAN WOMEN-YOUTH EMPOWEREMENT IN COTTAGE INDUSTRY OF SMALL-SCALE VALUE ADDITION IN GEMSTONES, POTTERY & CERAMIC



The African Minerals and Geosciences Centre (AMGC) provides different capacity building trainings in an effort to assist in developing mineral resources and ensure prosperity in the African continent. Among the training provided are the Gemstone Identification and Value Addition Techniques and the Pottery and Ceramic Simple Technology courses to encourage Women-Youth Empowerment in small scale Gemstones Industry as well as in simple technology of Pottery-Ceramic Industry. We believe such initiation of small scale businesses will contribute honourably in building skills, poverty eradication, raising living standards and eventually the GDP of African states including the AMGC''s member states.

Training on Pottery and Ceramic Technology

- Introduction on pottery and ceramics
- Single raw material test
- Clay body formulation
- Glaze and decorations
- Kilns and firing

Training on Gemstone Identification and Value Addition Techniques

- Physical and optical properties of gemstones
- Working principles of gemological tools and equipment
- Testing and identification of gemstones
- Rough gemstones sorting and grading
- Different techniques for value addition in gemstones
- Evaluation of cut gemstones
- Different treatments on gemstones
- Marketing plans and techniques for handling gemstones
- Techniques used in identifying synthetic stones and imitations in the gem market

The Pottery and Ceramic Technology training is delivered in a period of four weeks while the Gemstone Identification and Value Addition Techniques training is a three weeks program. The cost for training is US\$ 400.00 per participant per week, this include lunch, tea/coffee, training materials and local transport. Member state of AMGC, who fulfilled their financial commitments to the Centre, enjoy 40% cost reduction. Accommodation is covered by participants in convenient hotels in the proximity of the Centre's premises ranging from US\$20.00 to US\$50.00 per day.

In reference to the Directives of the 38th Meeting of the Governing Council of the African Minerals and Geosciences Centre (AMGC) which was held on 08 June 2018 in Dar es Salaam, Tanzania. The Governing Council on paragraph 23, regarding the need of establishment of Gemmological Centres in AMGC member states directed the Centre to avail necessary support to member states who are willing to establish Gemmological Centres in their countries. In this regard, AMGC has assisted in establishment of Geological Centres or Units in both Tanzania and Sudan. The Centre kindly repeats its request for any such requirements within its other member states so that we can provide necessary information and assistance.


The Centre started a two weeks comprehensive paid training (23 January - 03 February 2023) on Basic Gemmology Skills. The participant is Madam Naila Juma Mburu, the Laboratory Assistant at Mineralogy, Petrology & Gemmology department (MPGD). She has expressed her keen interest to have a paid training and certificate to build capacity in her day today activities at the department, and the management approved a 20% reduction in the training cost to be deducted from her salary for the coming six months, as a special offer to staff interested in enjoying mineral services including training provided by the Centre. It is worth mentioning that Madam Naila have served the Centre indirectly by working as a house maid for two former director generals during 2003-2015 and consequently given the opportunity through an attachment to be trained in both Ceramic Section and MPGD so as to be an icon at the Centre for its efforts in Women-**Empowerment.** Upon satisfactory result, assessment recommendations by the managers of the two departments, Madam Naila was employed as a laboratory assistant in the two departments. According to a written request and recommendation from the Senior Technician at Ceramic Section, she had the opportunity to join the technical staff of the section in 2017 advance Training Course on Ceramic Production Techniques for Developing Countries held for 3 weeks in China. Recently Madam Naila has decided to improve her English fluency by participating in paid evening classes for six months at British School in Dar es Salaam, Tanzania.

NEW Training Courses

African Minerals and Geosciences Centre (AMGC) is pleased to announce the introduction of four new courses Geostatistics, Petroleum Sciences and Resource Estimation in collaboration with Khartoum based Consulting firm called **Knowledge and Training Centre (KTC).** The course shall be facilitated by the Director of KTC, Dr. M. Zayed Awad, an eminent specialist in the areas of Geostatistics, resource evaluation, stratigraphy, reporting, training and mentoring, risk and decision analysis, petroleum economics, project management. The training course will be organized in Dar es Salaam at the AMGC training facilities. The following training courses are going to be offered through this collaboration.

1. Fundamental of Petroleum Economics

Duration: One Week **Course fee:** US\$ 1,200

This course introduces the participants to requirements for conducting petroleum economics; different stages of the petroleum industry life cycle involving upstream, mid-stream and downstream sectors will be explained. Participants will learn how to construct a Cash Flow Model for oil and gas investment decision. They will also learn how to deal with the different financial components of petroleum cost, and classification of costs into OPEX and CAPEX. Net Cash Flow Stream analysis and computation of economic indicators (Yardsticks) such as NPV, IRR, PBP, MCE and DPI, and their interpretations are essential for petroleum investment decision-making. Cash Flow Adjustment using discount rates is also considered. Types of fiscal regimes will be explained, participant will also learn how to incorporate the fiscal parameters into a cash flow stream.

2. Geostatistical Mineral Resource Estimation

Duration: One Week **Course fee:** US\$ 1,700

The course will focus on the fundamentals of Geostatistical application in mining that are required for domain specification that are required for mineral resource estimation and will include hands-on training with Geostatistical software. Geostatistical conditional Simulations may be used to assess the uncertainty associated with the Reserves Evaluation at exploration,

feasibility, and production stages. The simulations provide a range of potential reserves for the ore body's Tonnage, Metal Quantity and Recovered Grade.

3. Introduction to Oil and Gas Industry

DURATION: One Week **Course fee:** US\$ 1,200

This course is designed for a wide-ranging of petroleum industry personnel. It is designed to provide green-hands technical, and a non-technical personnel with practical petroleum industry life cycle. The course covers the key phases of the exploration, development and production industry as well as transportation and refining of crudes oils.

4. Geostatistics for Mining - foundation Course

Duration: Two Weeks **Course fee:** US\$ 2,000

Geostatistics, in combination with other statistical methods, offers a wide range of mathematical tools that can be used to analyze, model, provide estimates and assess uncertainties, for different types of spatial phenomena, for example, grades or geological features. The course will focus on the fundamentals of Geostatistics and statistics and will include hands-on training with Geostatistical software.

THE INSTRUCTOR



Dr. M. Zayed Awad, the former Sudanese Minister for Oil and Gas (September 2014-May 2017) BSc (Hons) from University of Khartoum, Sudan, MSc (Geol) from Technical University of Berlin (TU), PhD (Stratigraphy) from Technical University of Berlin (TU). Dr. Zayed is a university instructor with postgraduate qualifications in petroleum geology, stratigraphy, economic geology, Geostatistics, and relevant application soft wares. He has more than 35 years' experience in university teaching and more than 25 years worldwide experience in

the petroleum industry and training. He has supervised many MSc and PhD research students and reviewed several reports and research papers. He is the founder of Knowledge & Training Center (KTC) in Sudan, and he is active as a trainer since 2003. He worked on many projects and given training courses to hundreds of attendees on many aspects of geology. Dr. Zayed's skills are in Geostatistics, resource evaluation, stratigraphy, reporting, training and mentoring, risk and decision analysis, petroleum economics, project management. Dr. Zayed was the initiator and editor-in-Chief of the book titled "Petroleum Geology and Resources of the Sudan" published by Geozone (Berlin) in 2015.

LIST OF TRAINING COURSES

Tanzanian government issued a new directive on restrictions with regards to the COVID-19.
